

John 17:1

...Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:

John 17:9-10

I pray for them: I pray not for the world, but for which thou hast given me; for they are thine. And all mine are thine, and thine are mine; and I am glorified in them

John 17:21

Program Note


A few months ago my mom went to her hometown of Beaver, Pennsylvania. Upon returning from her trip, she told me how she was looking through some of my Grandpa's old things tucked away in the attic when she found something that she wanted me to have: a wellworn King James Bible.

I don't remember much about my Grandpa because he died when I was four, but as I opened the Bible I was amazed to find a few passages marked by old newspaper clippings. As I flipped to the marked pages, I felt close to my Grandpa knowing I was reading the same passages he had read years ago.
