This Hour

For Elzbieta Sajka-Bachler and the Pandolfis Consort

A book of Rose Ausländer's English poems, The Forbidden Tree, arrived in the mail, with a request to set several of the poems for inclusion in a future recording with Pandolfis Consort. Found in a bookshop by Ela Sajka-Bachler, the book arrived shortly after I had completed setting poems by Selma Meerbaum-Eisinger, a young Jewish poet from Czernowitz who died in a Nazi labor camp at the age of eighteen. The coincidence of the arrival of this book is extraordinary, as I soon discovered, after reading that Rose Ausländer was also born in Czernowitz, although a generation earlier than Selma Meerbaum-Eisinger. After migrating to the United States and becoming a citizen, Rose Auslander returned to Czernowitz to care for her elderly mother – only to become trapped there when the Nazi army occupied Romania. But unlike her younger compatriot, Rose Ausländer survived the war and lived on, continuing to write poetry, in both English and German until her death in 1988. One has to wonder, although I could not find evidence for it, whether these two writers knew one another, despite their age difference, or, perhaps, walked right past one another, unknowingly, on the streets of Czernowitz.

The door. Not the thing of wood. The door open to doors. Open to open doors to open roads to the grove.


The grove, not the trees of wood. The grove of breathing trees trees breathing green breathing growth breeding brotherly touch of air air thrilling the breath air entering the door.




















































A few words about (and by) the composer

Stan Grill was raised in the Bronx, studied at the Bronx House School of Music, and later graduated from the Manhattan School of Music with undergrad and graduate degrees in music theory. He studied piano with Robert Helps and Leon Kushner and composition with Ursula Mamlok and Joseph Prostakoff. Major works include music for symphony, chamber and string orchestra, a viola concerto, a cello concerto, ten string quartets, a nonet for winds and strings, and numerous song cycles for mixed voices and chamber ensemble. Performances have been produced by the composer, as well as presented by the Composers Guild of New Jersey, the St. Paul's Church Festival of the Arts, the Leonia Chamber Players, the New York Composers Circle, the Northern New Jersey Camerata, One World Symphony, the Bronx Arts Ensemble, the Tokyo based Duo + Ensemble, the Pandolfis Consort, the Aliquot Duo, Eight Strings and a Whistle, the Diderot Quartet and Camerata Philadelphia.

Stan's discography includes "Rustling Flights of Wings" with soprano Nancy Allen Lundy, pianist Stephen Gosling and violinist Ralph Farris and "At the Center of All Things" with music performed by the Diderot String Quartet.

"As I see it, as much as we strive to find reason and purpose in our having been born into this amazing, mysterious and awe-inspiring universe, that attempt is largely futile. It is however, the best part of our nature that obliges us to make the attempt, though the most we can hope for is to gain some small degree of understanding of the world around us, and, more importantly, of ourselves. To achieve this, we each approach the problem in our own way, uniquely shaped by our cultural background, innate talents and abilities, education and so on. For some, science may be the window through which they best perceive and interpret the world, for others, religion. For those to whom the world seems to express itself most clearly and beautifully through sound, music is the voice that speaks to us and through which we, in turn, best express ourselves. Now, I can write notes that will make pretty music because I've been trained to do so – but the best of my music has arrived, rather inexplicably, as part of a personal effort to understand the world and myself. It is, in a way, an act of translation. The world says something, I try to understand it, and then translate it into musical language. The particular musical language which I speak, is, of course, a product of my conservatory training and personal musical tastes, but hopefully, the outcome, imperfect a translation as it may be, will convey to others something of its original intent."

Stan's music is melodic, modal, contrapuntal, characterized by extended, interweaving lines. His musical influences span the centuries, and include Machaut, Josquin, Palestrina, Monteverdi, Lassus, Britten, Ives, Vaughn Williams and Shostakovich. Two main themes permeate many of the pieces - music intended to influence the minds and hearts of those who hear it in such a way as to encourage thoughts about the possibility of world peace - and music composed in an attempt to translate something about the nature of the physical world.
