PERFORMANCE INSTRUCTIONS

The two-page score is performed by two soprano recorders in the following manner: Performer I plays the first row (one 6/4 measure), then the Performer II plays the next (second) row, then the Performer I takes the third row, etc. The playing should be equal, as if performed by a single player. Switching from one performer to another should not be perceptible. All notes are performed *staccato*, and *piano*. The tempo is steady, medium.

It will be possible to arrange this piece for other instrument(s). One possibility is a solo guitar.
