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### **READ ME IF YOU DARE**

#### So Grasshopper, you want to play this music hu? Well read on!

This piece is broken up into five sections. These sections should be played together with a slight pause between each section.

OPENING
Think of this as an overture of sorts, just like in a play. It lays out all the musical materials that will be explored throughout the piece. The challenge here is to play the music so brilliantly so magnificently with so much feeling and of course precisely, right from the start so, that every listener will recognize the melodies, even if they are hearing it for the first time.

VARIATION/STUDY I (Broken Lines)

This section deals with the melodic materials in a very rhythmically, somewhat crazy and marginally uneven sort of way. Do not forget to count and Watch out for meter changes in this one!

VARIATION/STUDY II (Fast notes from hell)

Try to work on playing this variation as fast as you can. Also be sure to concentrate on making the 16th notes as even and fluid as possible. Think Disco and you should be ok

VARIATION/STUDY III (Welcome to the long tones)

This variation should challenge your patience as well as your bow control, How slow and beautifully can you play a single note? I think we are going to find out.

This is your last chance to make the audience weep with joy and heap the love of the people upon you, don't blow it!

#### LEGEND

Stuff you need to know before you can play this crazy thing

Stravinsky Coma Bartok Pizzicato

= Big Meat & PIZZICATO = TRILL BY /Z STEP Trill by half step

= TAST AS POSSIBLE Tremolo

Hard accented note = ABRUPT ACCENT

= 5 HORT ACCENT Very short note

= RAPID Scaled PASSAGE Glissando

= Natural Harmonic

Hug or plant a tree, it sacrificed it's life to make your instrument and this piece of music possible


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
